


Physician's Role in Filing Medical Exemptions in California for K-12 Schools & Childcare (Pre-K)

How to File for Medical Exemptions

<u>Background:</u> Effective January 1, 2021, the passage of Senate Bills (SB) 276 and 714 require California physicians (MD and DO) to file new immunization Medical Exemptions (ME) electronically on the California Immunization Registry (CAIR) Medical Exemption web portal: <u>CDPH CAIR-ME</u>. This policy applies to all Pre-K and K-12 students enrolled in both public and private schools and childcare agencies in California.

If the physician has determined that a student qualifies for a medical exemption (e.g. child was previously infected with chickenpox and has a positive Varicella IgG titer, OR child is a bone marrow transplant recipient and cannot receive live vaccines), the issuing physician and parent/guardian should follow the steps below to request and file an immunization medical exemption.

NOTE: Laboratory antibody titer reports must be uploaded to CAIR-ME when requesting a medical exemption on CAIR-ME to document prior history of disease. A medical exemption may be issued no more than 12 months before a child first enters a grade span (grade spans are birth-preschool, $TK/K-6^{th}$ grade, and $7^{th}-12^{th}$ grade).
