- Head Dep, DA, Sex Crimes Div, Guillermo Santiso introduced by LAC SAC co-chair Rachel Greene.
- Mr. Santiso provided a presentation on LACO DA, the largest sexual crimes division in the country with 1 to 3 sex crimes division in each courthouse. Mr. Santiso explained the threshold for filing standards as "beyond a reasonable doubt", and recommended outreach, regular interactions with CBOs, cross training and reviewing the data on where support services are lacking to help move survivors from "uncooperative" to "supportive" by helping them to better understand their options and how the system functions.
